#### **QUESTION 1**

- 1. Sibongile Shiba is a 24 year old married female experiencing her first pregnancy. Sibongile's husband accompanies her during a seventh month prenatal visit. He asks the nurse midwife "Is it okay to have sex?" The best response is:
- A. It's best to avoid intercourse in the third trimester
- B. Intercourse increases the risk of preterm labour
- C. Intercourse increases the risk of infection

#### **QUESTION 3**

Describe how a midwife should respond to each of the following clients concerns and questions.

- A. Lindiwe, is 7 months pregnant and working as a secretary full time. She asks the midwife if she should take a laxative tablet that a friend gave her because she has noticed that her ankles swell up at the end of the day. 5 Marks
- B. Girlie is in her third trimester of pregnancy. She tells the midwife that her posture seems to have changed and that she occasionally experiences low back pain.
   5 Marks
- C. Maria, who is 36 weeks pregnant with her first baby, calls her community midwife stating that she knows the baby is coming since she felt uterine contractions before getting out of bed in the morning. Maria confirms that they seem to have decreased in intensity and frequency since she has gotten out of bed and walked around.

- Zodwa, is a primigravida who is 32 weeks gestation. When she comes for a prenatal visit, she reports that she has been experiencing occasional periods of shortness of breath during the day. Sometimes she has to use an extra pillow to sleep comfortably. Zodwa expresses concern that she is developing a breathing problem.
