# **SECTION A (COMPULSORY)**

Read the case and then answer the questions that follow.

### **Question 1: CASE STUDY**

Excelsior is a farm along the Orange River in the Northern Cape that produces early table grapes for export to Europe. The farm also sends grapes to the local fruit processors for drying. It has recently experienced some difficulties, which are threatening the future of the farm.

The workers threatened to go on strike, right in the middle of the picking season because they claimed that their housing is of a very poor standard. They also claimed that they are not being paid the correct rate for shift work, as the grapes have to be picked at night; and that there is no proper grievance procedure on the farm.

There has been a rise in the value of the rand and this has reduced sales, as the grapes are more expensive in Europe. The worldwide recession has also had a negative effect on the market. Other management problems are that prices have dropped at the fruit dryers because of over-supply, there are more competitors and the high cost of fuel and electricity. Coupled with recent flood damage to some vineryards, it has decreased their profits.

Managers have trouble getting the local workers to do the work as some are not productive and absenteeism is high (especially on a Monday owing to excessive drinking). As a result, they have started employing Zimbabweans as contract workers during the picking season. This has been unpopular with the local people.
