QUESTION 1

 Evaluate the following research design with respect to methods used and the control provided.

A researcher wanted to ascertain if homogeneous grouping improves learning in a first course in biology. The researcher designated one of two high schools in a small town to serve as the experimental school and the other, as the control. Both schools had about the same number of students in each of four sections of science. In the experimental school pupils were grouped homogeneously on the basis of Intelligent Quotient (IQ) and scores on the achievement tests in science. In the control school pupils were placed in sections at random. At the end of the year all pupils were given a standardized test in biology. Statistical tests showed the experimental group to be superior on the test. The researcher concluded that homogeneous grouping results in greater learning in biology. (12 marks)
